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### **Welcoming in the program more doctors for Brazil**

in 2013, the federal government of Brazil created the Program More Doctors for Brazil (PMMB), which is part of a wide-ranging pact to improve the service to users of the Unified Health System (SUS), in order to accelerate investment in infrastructure in hospitals and health unities, as well as increase the number of doctors in poor areas of the country. It seeks to address the emergency issue of basic health care, but also generate links between participating physicians, their patients and the community enrolled, ensuring inclusion and democratization of access to health. It also seeks to better training for the SUS, which is scheduled to expanding the supply of graduate vacancies and residency and changes in medical training.

To practice medicine in Brazil, the Ministries of Health and Education, in partnership with the Pan American Health Organization (PAHO), held a formative time with doctors of the More Doctors Program for Brazil, called "welcoming module". Its goal is to integrate it for general operations in Primary Care in the SUS context.

Considering the Federal Law 12,871 / 2013, the welcoming module is seen as primordial stage and qualifying for entry into the PMMB, and has 03-week evaluation with teachers of public universities. The methodology of this welcoming module is on display through dialogue, study of recurrent cases and Brazilian clinical protocols.

The trial period proposed by the welcoming module is essential for foreign doctors become familiar with the SUS in Brazil, and to prepare them for the health services with all its peculiarities.

It is expected that the arrival of these doctors helps to bring SUS principles to our medical practice, with social, ethical and committed look to improving population's quality of life.
