### **Challenges in the use of classifications in general practice**

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How can the various classification systems used in the health care sector be integrated into the domain of general practice to optimally describe the challenges of future expectations and content of work in general practice? Increased need to focus on multimorbidity, risk factors - individual and universal - preventive efforts, intersectorial collaboration and resource consumption increases the need for integration between the classification systems, which describes general practice domain and classification systems used in other health care domains.
